Beef State Fair and Best Show Info

NEW for 2024: Ohio State Fair will NOT be providing EID tags for market beef entries. Exhibitors must get their own 840 tags. The EID 840 tag number MUST be listed on the envelope with the DNA sample. The DNA sample kits will be available in the Extension Office in November. State Fair deadline is January 15th to submit DNA sample.

Youth showing at any of the BEST sanctioned shows must have EID tags in their calves prior to the first show in which they exhibit. BEST shows prior to January 15 deadline to submit samples to OSF include: *Mardi Gras Masquerade* (November 17-19, Circleville), *AGR Holiday Classic* (December 8-10, Columbus), *Saddle & Sirloin Spectacular* (December 29-31, Circleville), and *Scarlet & Gray Midwest Showdown* (January 5-7, Columbus).

NEW for 2024 County: In order to assist many of our exhibitors who participate in State Fair and BEST Shows, the County will be using 840 EID tags on all fats this year. The tags are currently on order and should be here in approximately two weeks. If you have a beef animal you plan to tag in December and are taking to state or BEST shows, you may get a tag early. The County tags are for only those beef animals going to be carried as 2024 4-H and FFA projects. The Extension Office will send out a notice when the 840 tags arrive. Ohio 4-H Achievement Record



The gateway to state and national 4-H opportunities, trips, and experiences!

The Ohio 4-H Achievement Record is a comprehensive record of a 4-H member's career, accomplishments, and achievements. It is a great way to capture all the experiences they have had in 4-H, practice for filling out future job or college applications, and get a head start on applying for scholarships.

There are 27 project area categories in which to apply, such as individual animal projects, citizenship, community service, clothing, creative arts, woodworking, shooting sports, leadership, and more! 4-H members can submit multiple achievement records in different categories based on their 4-H involvement. State winners in each category win a trip to events such as National 4-H Congress, National Dairy Conference and the Shooting Sports Teen Leadership Institute. These events encourage members to expand their skills, engage with other 4-H members, and inspire them to make an impact in their communities!

How do I get started?

Start by filling out the Achievement Record. The Ohio 4-H Achievement record can be found at ohio4h.org/awardsandscholarships. Sections include 4-H project work, 4-H participation, major 4-H honors, 4-H community service and citizenship activities, 4-H educational leadership, office and committee leadership, and non-4-H experiences, in addition to a written 4-H story and photo page reflecting on the member's 4-H experiences and impact.



1. Contact your county office

Contact your county 4-H professional for information about county deadlines, review process, and what local opportunities may be available through completing the achievement record!



2. Complete the Achievement Record

Complete all sections of the achievement record form. Be sure to follow the guidelines and show a cumulative record of your 4-H career! Applications can be tailored to the project area you are applying for.



3. Submit to your county office

Submit to your county 4-H professional by the deadline. State selections are made in February and state winners are notified in the spring.

Ohio 4-H Global Immersion Project - Greece

When: March 31st – April 10th, 2024.

Who: Ohio 4-H Teens 15-18 (*Teens are nominated by Ohio 4-H Professionals*) **Where:** American Farm School (https://www.afs.edu.gr/) - Thessaloniki, Greece

What: Cross-Cultural and Agricultural Career field exploration program designed to help youth learn about Ag careers, cross-cultural interactions, workforce preparation and leadership skills. Teens will be part of a "Work Internship" with AFS Greek high school students and work in cohorts to focus on different Agricultural program units that include: Animal and Plant Production, Food Science & Technology, and more.
 Cost: To be determined – final cost based on Grants received (Estimate-\$2,400 – includes airfare, most meals,

lodging, ground transportation, park entrance and program fees.)

<u>Participant Selection:</u> Ohio 4-H Professionals have the opportunity to nominate youth. Final selection will be based on geographic and demographic characteristics and the below criteria:

- Have an interest in agriculture or are unsure what career path they'd like to pursue.
- Can embrace unique and different cultures beyond their local communities.
- Willing to share their experiences through presentations, blogs, photos, etc. at the local and state level.
- A good representation of the local 4-H program.
- Teen who has not expressed interest in pursuing statewide 4-H opportunities before.

Additional Trip Components Include:

Student Workshops: Tasting and Sensory analysis of Olive Oil, Cheese, and other local foods. Mediterranean diet: science and culture.

Recreation: Sports, teambuilding and Leadership activities with AFS students, hiking Mount Olympus (highest peak in Greece – 9,573

ft.), trekking in Enipea Canyon, waterfalls, and more

Tours: Meteora (11th Century Monasteries built on gigantic rocks), Farmers Market of Voulgari, Aristotle's Park, Anel Honey Park,

Marianna's Vine leaves (pit stop featured on Amazing Race – Season #35) and more...
