#### Guidelines for Booth Set-up:

Each club can only have 5 people per club in the building during your time slot. Masks are **REQUIRED**, please maintain 6 feet between your group and any other group in your aisle. Once your time slot has ended you will be asked to make final adjustments and clear out for the next round. I appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

Every project that would have been judged during Non-Livestock Judging week, including all Cloverbud activities are required to be in the building within the club's allotted space. We want to avoid any empty spaces. If you have a member who is apprehensive of their project being on display, for this year **ONLY**, they may replace their project with a Tri-Fold poster Board including photos of their project, activities completed while completing the project, project name and their name and age. Along with their project book.

Each square on the grid is approximately 2 foot. The booth spaces on the outside walls will be divided by 3 foot high curtains and will have peg boards on the walls. The middle rows of booths will have 8 foot curtain in the back and will also be divided by 3 foot curtains on the sides. At 2:00 on Thursday, August 6, we will run plastic chain along the front of the booths to keep visitors out of the booths. There will be 6 and 8 foot tables available for your club to use in your display. **IF YOU BORROW A TABLE, YOUR CLUB WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR RETURNING IT TO THE STORAGE AREA AT BOOTH TEAR DOWN, NO EXCEPTIONS!**

**PLEASE NOTE:** You **cannot** use pins in the curtains. You **cannot** use nails or staples in the peg board. Please come prepared to set up your booth accordingly. You may hang 1 sign with string or wire from the posts that hold the curtains, but it cannot be more than 5 pounds in weight. We suggest using an easel to display signage or building something that will stand alone to hold your signage.

All Directors' Order from the Ohio Department of Health that will be followed. Details can be found on Ohio.Gov Website. Some items to point out.

-Curfew 10pm daily. Everyone will need to leave the fairgrounds or go to their campers.

-If an event goes past 10pm, everyone will be expected to leave within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the event.

Facial coverings:

All individuals in attendance at and participating in 4-H and FFA Junior Fair activities shall wear a facial covering at all times when:

a. In any indoor location (this includes all barns with a roof) which is not a residence (camper) or

b. Outdoors and unable to consistently maintain a distance of six feet or more from individuals who are not members of their family/household.

Facial coverings do not apply when:

- a. Under age of 10
- b. Medical conditions including those with respiratory conditions that restrict breathing, mental health conditions, or disability, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication;
- d. The individual is seated and actively engaged in consuming food or beverage.
